

THE REPRESENTATIVE BODY

GRANTS FOR THE REPAIR, EXTENSION, OR PROVISION OF PLACES OF WORSHIP

Criteria

1. Applications must be supported by the Archdeacon and Diocesan Churches and Pastoral Committee.
2. The Churches and Pastoral Committee must provide confirmation that the church will not close within 5 years.
3. Works must be in accordance with faculty rules and, where applicable, planning permission and building regulations.
Applications for the construction of new places of worship must be endorsed by the Bishop. The site for the new church must be in the ownership of the Representative Body.
4. The resources available for grants are limited and the Committee will wish to see that the parish has made every effort to secure funds from external sources. The maintenance of existing places of worship will be the priority and, in relation to extension, re-ordering or new construction, the parish will need to show a genuine need. The Committee will be influenced by the desire to meet the needs of an increasing congregation; the improvement of the use and facilities in an existing building; meeting the requirements of current legislation (such as Disability Discrimination Act 1995 and Health & Safety Regulations).
5. For grants over £5,000, the results of Part I of the Representative Body guidance note "Appraising Church Buildings" should be provided showing that the church will perform a key role in future outreach within the parish.
6. Grants are payable either in full at the completion of the works or in stage payments supported in each case by a copy of the appointed architect's certificate or equivalent professionally qualified advisor's endorsement.
7. Additional grant forms should be obtained from the Representative Body. Please do not take copies as the forms are sometimes amended. The forms are available as e-mail attachments if desired.
8. Grants must be taken up within 2 years of the date of the award and no further applications for that church will be considered for two years, except in exceptional circumstances.

Eligible Costs

- Works of repair to the fabric of a church, excluding stained glass or decoration unless such works represent less than 10% of a major repair project.
- Works of major re-ordering will be considered where they are clearly part of the Parish's Mission Plan following an assessment in accordance with the guidance note "Appraising Church Buildings".
- Works to improve safety and accessibility
- Extensions
- New churches

It is available at main public reference libraries. The *Directory* lists a large number of organisations that may accept applications for grant-aid, states their relevant criteria, and indicates the approximate annual income of each charity. It also contains important advice on how to present your applications. You are advised to read this very carefully and be guided by it. It is now also available on CD-ROM. The *Directory* is updated twice yearly. Some dioceses have a copy of the *Directory* that they are prepared to let parishes borrow; it may be worthwhile asking.

Be ready for a high proportion of disappointing replies. It pays to be persistent however; the last trust on your list could be the one, which is willing to help you.

Listed Places of Worship Grant Scheme: **With effect from April 2004, listed places of worship throughout the UK have been able to claim the full amount of VAT paid on eligible works carried out on and after 1 April 2004.**

Claims for eligible works carried out between 1 April 2001 and 31 March 2004 will continue to receive the difference between 5% and the actual amount of VAT paid.

Applications can only be made:

- For listed places of worship
- In arrears
- For work carried out after 1 April 2001

The grant scheme is administered by the Department of Culture, Media and Sport.

Landfill Tax Credit Scheme: The Landfill Tax Credit Scheme (LTCS) was designed to help mitigate the effects of landfill upon local communities and support moves to more sustainable waste management practices. It encourages partnerships between landfill operators, their local communities and the voluntary and public sectors. Since 1996 landfill operators have been permitted to offset up to 20% of their tax obligations as a credit which can be applied to environmental bodies and projects which can include the maintenance and repair of church buildings.

The regulatory body of the Landfill Tax Credit Scheme is Entrust from whom an information pack is available. A list of local contractors should be available from your local authority. Some local councils and dioceses have already enrolled themselves and local projects can therefore benefit from this. You should check with the relevant local authority and with your diocese. The Government has recently changed the regulations governing the (LTCS) so that more money is available for initiatives to encourage sustainable waste management. This has meant that less money is available for projects such as repairing a church building.

Aggregates Levy Sustainability Fund: A similar scheme to the Landfill Tax Credit Scheme, the Aggregates Levy Sustainability Fund seeks to address quarrying's impact on the environment by funding 6 types of project in locations upto 5 miles from a quarry site:

- Environmental and Amenity projects to benefit communities affected by aggregate extraction
- Conserving and improving sites of special interest
- Education projects
- Reducing the impact of quarrying
- Promoting the use of alternative materials
- Amending or revoking old mineral permissions

Some parishes have been successful in getting grants from this fund for various purposes.
