Safeguarding Training Framework

Learning opportunities co-ordinated locally will embrace a wide range of delivery methods beyond a 'classroom' type setting including activities such as podcasts, workshops, newsletters and e-learning. Reference to 'training' in this document therefore includes a range of activities aimed to develop participants skills, knowledge, attitudes and practice in safeguarding.

The provision of training will embrace the principles of dialogue and engagement in a trusting space. This approach is intended to affect participant's values and behaviours to influence and achieve good safeguarding outcomes.

Safeguarding training pathways

The Church in Wales has core elements of safeguarding learning which have been developed to build learning according to role and responsibilities. There are additional learning modules that have been developed to enhance safeguarding knowledge on particular subject areas, or for specific roles.

This framework outlines the modular detail to explain who requires what training at the appropriate level. It also sets out the training outcomes for each module. People are expected to achieve the required level of learning as soon as is practicable upon request to commence in role, and in every case within a maximum of three months of appointment.

Refresher learning is provided and should be completed at three yearly intervals. Participants will be contacted by the Provincial Safeguarding Team when refresher training is required. Training at the appropriate level must also be undertaken when an individual takes on a new role.

Delivery of safeguarding training is undertaken by the Provincial Safeguarding Team's experienced and skilled trainers .

Diocesan based Safeguarding workshops

Beyond the "classroom" type setting we will be providing further learning opportunities via workshops on a diocesan level. These will be focussed on general safeguarding issues and will be an opportunity to look in detail at any recurring safeguarding issues on a diocesan

level. We will also work with external statutory and non-statutory agencies to arrange or commission workshops in response to safeguarding developments where appropriate.

Monitoring attendance

The provincial safeguarding team will seek assurance regarding attendance and compliance with training requirements and will work with dioceses to achieve this. Attendance at safeguarding training will be recorded consistently and accurately in the safeguarding training central database 'My Church People' to ensure that all attendees have a learning record. Such records will enable refresher sessions to be identified and will further facilitate the monitoring and assurance of safeguarding learning. Details of training attendance will be available to each diocese and will be used to inform reporting and assurance processes.

Successful completion

Although our courses do not have an assessment, individuals will be required to demonstrate understanding during the sessions in order to successfully complete the relevant modules. This will be at the discretion of the trainer. Following course completion a certificate will be sent to the participant. Participants will evidence their updated skills and knowledge in their everyday work.

Where participants do not engage or are deliberately difficult or disruptive the trainer will be responsible for ensuring that this behaviour is not accepted. Anyone attending who fails to participate or engage will be spoken to privately to ascertain if there are reasons for this. Where there are no justifiable reasons for a participant not engaging it may be necessary to report their lack of participation to the appropriate person, such as diocesan bishop for clergy, or line manager for employees and volunteers. Individuals whom have not fully participated or engaged in the safeguarding learning will not be issued with a certificate of completion.
